We soon got into more typical rounds including a round of spelling. A bit of local flavour with question seven from Ineke "spell Manshande". Could have been


really difficult if John wasn't walking around the room with his name badge on!

Following our WOW Museum visit on 6 August, we will have a short discussion at the WOW café to canvas our clubs views on the proposal.

Dear regional VW Club,

As you no doubt already know, the Otago club is hosting the next VW Nationals in Dunedin over Easter next year. As you can also probably imagine, we have received many, many comments to date regarding the categorisation of show vehicles, not just regarding vehicle year and model, but also the issue of stock vs modified, best of show, best paint, engine, interior, furthest travelled etc etc.

In order to attempt to set a precedent for future Nationals, and to form a standardised, unified "nationwide" judging strategy, we wish to make a proposal to all the New Zealand Volkswagen clubs.

The following has been put forward by our Club Patron, Ken Berry, and we would welcome your response to his proposal:

To All VW Clubs

Having been associated with the VW Federation and the Otago VW Club since the nineteen fifties, I have seen and participated in many VW Nationals. Some have been fairly strict, some low key, and these often attract criticism towards the organisers.

We propose that our Nationals in 2012 will have a format as follows:

- 1. We will ask ALL clubs to nominate and supply 2 3 judges (who are obviously coming to Dunedin)
- 2. They should be either a) experienced, or b) willing to learn
- 3. We will have all the necessary classes (subject to vehicle numbers on the day) covered at our discretion, and including stock and modified for each class.
- 4. Stock means stock no exceptions at all
- 5. 5 Judges will cover each combined class
- 6. All categories will be catered for, unless lack of numbers dictates otherwise

Could you please discuss this amongst your respective committees and/or membership, and reply accordingly with your thoughts.
